- (1) taught a total of 6.0 online semester units for an accredited college or university within the last 5 years or
- (2) passed a class or classes totaling at least 2.0 semester units at an accredited college or university on the pedagogy of teaching online within the last 5 years or
- (3) demonstrate successful completion of SRJC online teaching training within the last 5 years or
- (4) demonstrate successful completion of at least 30 hours of certified training in teaching online from @ONE (or comparable organizations as determined by SRJC) within the last 5 years.
