Project Title Spring Back into Action (Restorative Circle/Workshop Series)

Project Description (Add pages, if needed)

This is an activity for the Student Success Team's final year utilizing a CCCO Innovation Award. The award allowed us to scale up practices District-wide amongst the three Student Success Coaching Teams. This workshop/intervention was previously offered on the Santa Rosa Campus, and hosted by the Welcome & Connect Center in partnership with a combination of faculty, staff and peer Student Success Coaches. The intent was to support first-year students who did not pass transfer-level math and English during their first attempt, allowing them a new support network, approach, and tools to utilize during their next attempt.

Using Restorative Justice practices, we are offering similar programming to support students who faced challenges with remote learning either at SRJC, their high-school, or elsewhere. We will also invite disproportionately impacted students who would also benefit from the same intervention and restorative circle activities. Facilitation will be led by a combination of faculty (5 per session) and relevant student support areas, the Santa Rosa Intercultural Center, the Welcome & Connect Center, and the Petaluma Student Success Team.

The workshops will take place on the following dates:

- 10/27 Wed 12-1:30
- 10/28 Thurs 3:30-5
- 11/1 Mon 3:30-5
- 11/2 Tues 12:30-2

Collaboration and preparation will occur between 10/1 and 10/26. Collaboration will be weekly one hour meetings, and preparation time allows for three additional hours.

Faculty may facilitate one or more workshops depending on availability.

### **Selection Process**
